## Seven Scenes From the Painting 'Exhuming the First American Mastodon' by C. W. Peale

- I. Youth with no name cuts out of the frame with an axe.
- II. Those who extol a bone on a scroll turn their backs, sanction his escape.
- III. Attached to his toe, shackles below the surface hold a neophyte fast who oggles aghast a bone of gold emblazoned with his name.
- IV. Three green umbrellas are shown in all. These denote degrees by which a fall (a fall from grace) may be measured as virtual, potential or as actual.
  - 1. the first has been dropped,
  - 2. the second picked up, but not untied.
  - 3. the third has been spread high over head to hide the sky.
- v. Nourished by the two syringes shown,
- VI. the wheel 'Nomenclator' (better known to the world as The High Priestess) names (i.e. defines) her victims forever.
- VII. John Masten has hung so long from a rung he now depends on it as much as from it for such a vantage lends itself

to one who proudly claims to be amphibious though actually allergic to the two predicaments to which his ladder leads.

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
